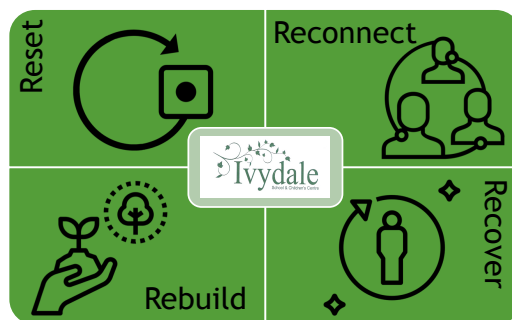

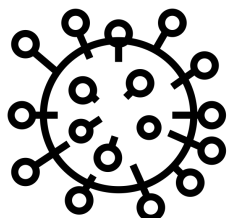

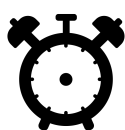

SCHOOL STREET CLOSURE

We are working with Southwark to improve safety outside all of our school gates. We are waiting for the go ahead for the temporary (closed for a short time in the morning and the afternoon) closure of Lanbury Road and the stretch of Inverton Road from the junction of Harlescott Road to the junction of Surrey Road. This means that if you drive your children to school you will have to park outside of this area and walk. While we are waiting for this to be implemented, why not start now and park safely further away and walk the last bit of your journey? This will be safer for everyone. More details will follow soon.

REMOTE LEARNING



Thank you to those of you who have already responded to our technology survey. If a class has to close due to Covid-19, this may happen very quickly and at that point we will move to remote learning. We are currently setting up Microsoft Class Teams as our online learning platform. Via this, teachers will set work and provide feedback to help and support learning and children will be able to communicate with their teachers. All children will have access to web-based versions of Word, Excel, PowerPoint and other Office. It will be important that you, as parents, manage your child's account. You will need to support them with accessing their account and learning and we will expect parents to monitor and support your child's learning at home if their class is closed. We will be sending out details of how to log on soon. Please follow the instructions in that letter carefully and let us know if you need any support with this.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Unfortunately our school uniform supplier has been an economic victim of the pandemic and is no longer producing printed jumpers or t-shirts. This has coincided with our decision to move to a simplified uniform by September 2021 of which there will be more information after half term. We have currently found a temporary, but unsustainable solution and we now do have jumpers and book bags available from the Bellwood office.
